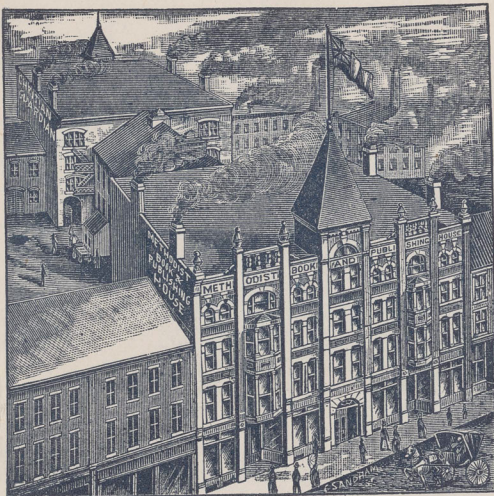

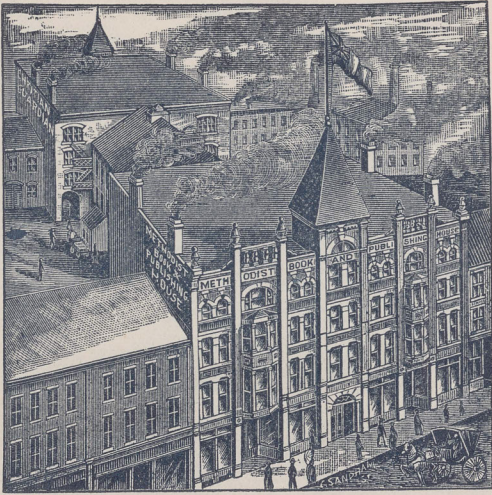
Dear Dr. Dawson,
