I am much indebted for
your proof of the 25th ult. and for
specimens put to hand. I hope shortly
to send you one or two specimens
of *Palaeospondylus*, in some respects
perhaps better than any I have yet
seen. - Calder of Turso has been
several times out at Aclamava
Hill, and procured a few specimens.

I am very much puzzled by the
numerous markings upon the
slabs in close association with
this form,

but I suppose, from appearances under
the microscope, *Palaeosporangia*
comes out distinct enough from
its surroundings, at least it appears
so to me, and the curious object
seems to persist as before. Perhaps
the new specimens *Calda* has found,
may show some points in a clearer
light.
