Sir,

I am directed to ask if you would be so good as to accord us an interview, at whatever time & place may suit your convenience; in order that we may have the opportunity of obtaining from you, in confidence, some particulars as to the actual working of the Education Acts in Quebec and Ontario.

The subject of denominational schools & public schools is now occupying considerable attention & demands the most careful study.

We have investigated the Canadian statutes and arrangements as far as we can; but it

would be most valuable to us, if we might obtain from you some information upon various points of practical working.

We should be glad to meet you at any place you may name, any morning this week, between 11.0 and 1.0, except Saturday. Or we should of course be glad to welcome you here, if you prefer calling at Whitehall.

Trusting that the great public interest of the matter may be held to justify us in asking of you this favour.
