I found the other day
 in looking over Huxley's Classification
 - which I have now got - what
 one of my strange tow net
 animals was. In one of the
 drawings I think you will find



a creature like this.
 It seems that it belongs
 to the class Chaetognathia
 which is closely allied to
 the worms, & only represented
 by one ~~of the~~ genus called
 Sagitta. If you compare my
 drawing to the cut, I think you will

find it sufficiently near.

In writing about the Ostracoids which Brady has sent, I did not mean to say that he had finished the Post Pliocene. It is only the recent that he has sent, though he says he is getting on with the p.p.
