Dear Papa

I have now been here two days & from present appearances hope to be able to leave on Monday morning by Stage for N. Glasgow. Two days there will I hope finish my business & then I will be very glad to get home. If a steamer is sailing at a convenient time I think I will be inclined to return thus. If not by train.

Of course if the weather looks
unsettled I will not go by water
but the chances seem in favour of
a foot-passage now.

I have with me here an old
miner named Wilson who accompanied
you at the foppins. He is now
underground viewer at Moors Colly.
We are having one of Lawsons trial
pits laded out & opened out to get a
look at the coal.

Before leaving Picton I got \$40 from
Primrose & I hope to be able to
return home on it.
