Dear Dr. Dawson,

We had a very comfortable journey down and arrived here about half-past three on Sunday afternoon. Anna and Miss Wilson were at the station having reached Bic about an hour before us. We found an opportunity for sending on the cheques and have since heard from Mrs. Dawson of the safe arrival of the vegetables at Intis.

The weather has been lovely here, though hotter than we left it in Montreal. Notwithstanding the fine scenery I do not think that this is a good place for health-seekers. It is so hemmed in by hills that the sea-breezes scarcely seem to find

their way in at all.

I intended to write long yesterday's post, but being attached to the staff of artists did not get in from the field in time. These artists have no realization of the flight of time.

I gave instructions at the Post Office with regard to my letters, but if any should by mistake find their way to the College will you kindly ask Hamilton to remail them to me at Annetta. We expect to go there this afternoon.
