My dear Father,

I today received yours
of Sept. 16th & warmly write
to acknowledge it & its arrival
here. I share what you say about
Orbitans plants & shell don't what
I can. I am rather sorry
that you should have mentioned
any thing about the Weverandum
in survey matters discussed
at Sir D.S. Macpherson's report to the
our minister Mr White. The
Wever. was an entirely private
affair for Macpherson's personal

information & should not be
 be found at all among the
 documents of the office. It
 might not be in fact a false
 position should it be produced.
 However it is likely that White will
 show to mind us about it
 again. I feared that the much
 spoken of small pox epidemic in
 Montreal would have a bad effect on
 classes in the College & per-
 haps that this is the case. It is
 unfortunate but cannot be helped.
 We arrived here at one P.M. today
 & after about two weeks in the
 Strait of Georgia - should the
 weather hold - I hope to turn toward

Victoria. The weather is a
rather uncertain quantity at
present but appears settled &
fine enough at present. Should
it become well bad I will
not hesitate to quit work
wherever I may be, as the delays
become so serious.
