WASHINGTON, D. C. May 1, 1894

My dear Father,

I did not manage to
get away at the time I expected,
but now think that I shall certainly
be able to leave tomorrow morning,
reaching Ottawa Thursday. I
propose going back to Ottawa direct,
via Rome's Point & Côtéau, there
being now such a lot of things which
need my attention there — besides
I happen to have taken a return
ticket by that route. Last night I saw
Uncle board, the Paladroit Point, who
desired to be kindly recommended to you,
He complains that with the Administration

force ever at his disposal, in
 way of assistants etc that he
 is quite unable to deal with
 his mass of material. He is
 working away at Potomac group
 things, & lately has been found in
 California representing a flora
