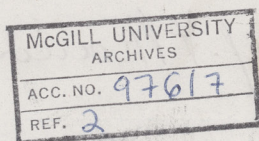
DR WALKER will continue to occupy my present residence, and will be ready, on all occasions, to give professional attendance on all who may honour him with their confidence.
