Dear Mamma, I have written you a long letter, but as it contained a great deal of news I sent it to Garry so you will get it I suppose tomorrow or next day - If papa has not gone tell him from Mr Weynes that the corporation meeting went off very well, & also ^{that} the arrangements for the Normal School were satisfactorily concluded. Mr W - has gone to Guelph for three days. I have had several letters from intending students desiring catalogues - I do hope that you are feeling settled & home-like & on no account dream of coming out till the barnishes do, you know you have not had a rest yet, & that is quite necessary before you come back, as far living in this desmantled house it is nonsense everything is tied up & put away for a two months

sleep, & after all our fine
cleaning it would be too bad
to dirty it before autumn.
