absence. I am sitting by
the open window in

Water of Long Island
Sound chattered over with
White Tail the Island 9
miles away is in full
view. In the afternoon
can see all the large
Steamers passing the
air is filled with the
perfume of flowers.
Now after I wish the
Hospital was near

that I might go in and cheer
the sick ones. I feel I receive much
benefit from visiting the Hospital
It makes me realize the shortness
of life and the need of winning
souls to Christ. Oh how I love the
work. It is very quiet here I may
say the essence of quietness
as I live in the County about
one hour ride from New York
I attend service in an old Church
108 years old. We have an excellent
Clergyman whose whole aim is to
bring souls to Christ. How much
I wish you were here I should so
enjoy your conversation when
I am here. I am perfectly isolated
from Society My Aunt - Mr. McMaster
has returned from her California
trip of two months and now
has moved out - their County
Residence. She says it is lonely
then now have some time I can
show it to you in person
but - I think Montreal the finest
City I ever visited with it. ^{Washing} _{Budding}

I spent - two days longer
than I expected in Toronto
to visit - some people in
the Hospital whom I knew
were dying one care I was
especially interested in
An English man who was
suffering from Dropsy of
the heart - and would not
allow any one to approach
him on the subject - my
religion, but I spent the
last - three afternoon at
the Hospital and I believe
My Heavenly Father
blessed the word to him
after I left I wrote Mr
Campbell asking her to
hear of him, I will
enclose her letter and if Miss
Walton is still with you
please let her read it as
I told her about him. He
said he had not spoken to
any one of his life.

Since he left - England that
he saw me it was a very
eventful one. If Miss
Walker upon it then I would
like her also to see it as
she was with me and you
to him also, I wish I could
visit the Hospital every day
It is such a satisfaction
