Dear Madam: -

At the first annual meeting of the New England Graduates' Society of Mc Gill University held in this city on Feb'y 8th, there were adopted the following resolutions, which I have pleasure in transmitting to you: -

Resolved: -

That this Society, having learned with deep sorrow of the death of Sir William Dawson, express its sympathy with Lady Dawson in her recent great bereavement: and that we, the members of this Society, record our sense of profound personal loss in the death of her husband, the
