I am able to take a little walk
each day. I do not see any
bad effects of the fever
remaining by such great
localities on one hand,
It troubles her, but I
hope it will pass away
in time. We were in
Hamilton first, staying
with Mr. & Mrs. Curran, &
came here on Saturday
I commenced meetings on
Sunday evening with the G. M. C. A.
forms. I am continuing
them each night, with
Bible readings in the
afternoon. The forms hold
\$100. About 70 were present
on Sunday evening, & the

Attendance was good for Monday
there seem to be some
earnest Christians here, &
great desire for blessing,
also a very friendly spirit.
So there is cause for encouragement
& expectations that the
Lord will show forth His
power now, & use very
able instruments for His
own glory in the conversion
of souls. I shall be very
glad when my companion
is able to do his part, but
I can hardly hope for it
this spring, & I do not
know yet whether we
shall return home for
the summer. I am glad
to hear Mrs. Barber is

well enough to include the
weekly Bible readings. She
never writes, & we have
learned nothing of her
since Mr. Ryan's death.
You do not say anything
yourself, so I trust
I think implies that you
are all well. With our
