We had on the whole a very pleasant journey. We arrived at York about nine. Next morning we had breakfast and then walked up to the York Cathedral which is something very fine, I think it is even more imposing than Westminster ably though of course there are not so many historical monuments there are however some very ancient relics in it one of which was a horn made of ivory which was given to the church

by one of the Saxon princes
