My dear Anna,

Here I am back in
my old quarters, with the bells
of St Margaret's, Westminster,
ringing out the usual prolonged
Saturday Song Service, & the
clock hours, the hours of
Parliament voting the hours
& quarters just as though I
had never left the place
last August. It is completely
another of the circles one seems

to make, returning on itself
 & cutting out a great loop of
 intermediate experiences.

Leaving New York Long Port
 Saturday morning, I reached
 London at 3.30 this (Saturday)
 afternoon, which makes a
 pretty good record.

Hope turned up at the Station
 at Liverpool this morning in
 time to have a short chat, but I
 could not wait there, as it
 seemed necessary to get on to
 London with all due speed.
 I shall hope to spend Christmas
 at Rock Ferry & then to
 deliver the various parcels

with which I am loaded,
 In New York, Foster
 undertook a general repacking
 of my havel bag & distributed
 the gifts between it & my
 carry - all etc in such a
 way that even had it seemed
 desirable to unload there
 upon Hesper, it would have
 been difficult to do so.
 Curiously enough, we found all
 the country about New York
 covered with snow, &
 though the weather on the
 Atlantic was warm &

pleasant, we struck a very
 chilly air near Ireland,
 a hard frost at Liverpool
 & a heavy snow everywhere
 in the inland country on the
 way from Liverpool to London.
 It is I believe snowing here
 tonight, but I have not been
 out to see.
