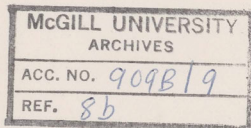

My dear Anna,

I have just

Circumstances, it is hard
 for me to say & I need not
 repeat what I have written to
 John as he will no doubt
 communicate this to you. It is
 too bad that you should have to
 leave Willbrae Place. I regret
 it perhaps nearly as much as
 you do, though not of course
 formally communicated by it
 in the same way.

As for Eric, I shall be very
 glad to do what I can to
 get him a summer out-of-doors.
 If I get back in time to
 go out west myself I can
 with little doubt arrange to
 take him with me, but how

long I may be kept here is
 quite quite uncertain. It
 will certainly be some weeks
 yet. Meanwhile I am
 writing to Dr Selwyn to
 ask if it would be possible
 to let him go with some one
 of the men who will be at
 work in the Eastern provinces,
 Quebec or New Brunswick
 or perhaps Ontario. It
 would of course be necessary
 for him to deliver himself
 at some appointed place & time,
 & as he has no technical

status he could not expect to
 get any remuneration or at
 least none worth mentioning. If
 this can be arranged I will
 be glad to be responsible for his
 travelling expenses to Henderson
 & also for any outfit which he
 might require. Perhaps Dr S.
 might be able to allow him to
 go with Dr Ellis or Mr McGinnis
 - either would be good, the latter
 most interesting because working in
 a newer country, west of Lake
 Superior. If anything should
 come of this, you may have to decide
 whether to accept the plan or
 wait on chance of my being able to
 return in time.
