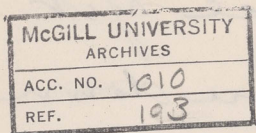


I scarcely know what kind of an attendant Eric would require if you were leaving him at Saranac for a time - a nurse? Very likely, however, Indian will advise his coming home.
