My dear Anna,

I keep inquiring about French work in these Provinces. There are quite a lot of "Acadian French" in these parts. In the north & east of Prince Edward Is^l; in Cape Breton; and perhaps chiefly in this southern end of Nova Scotia, in the Digby and Yarmouth region. I saw the Minister of the Presbyterian Church here today, to whom I have written about it; & he says a most encouraging colportage work has been done this last summer, all ~~around~~ ^{among} the outlying places all around here. So I feel sure a large opening might be found for French hospitals, if as you have said, the thing were pushed a little.

I am now writing to France
about the "Peep of Day" in French &
the "Pilgrims Progress." Do you think
these suitable and serviceable?

Of course relatively speaking, they
are expensive compared to Testaments
& gospels. The "Peep of Day" is 22¢
and for 15 or 20¢ you could get a
good large print New Testament.

It seems in a sense an ostentatious one;
and yet it might serve to interest
children in the gospel; or as an
"introduction" in the case of those
who have never read the gospels
themselves. You might think that
\$5.00 would go further in gospels, than
for a couple of dozen "Peep of Day".
I would however, be glad to know
what you do think.
