Just-a line to let you
know that we are alive
& flourishing. Svefn & I have
the most-tremendous appetites
& the food is splendid. The
bread & butter are delicious.
We are quite settled now.
Yesterday saw the finishing
when Svefn scrubbed out-
a top cupboard shelf &
I sewed up a couple of
cushion covers. We have
had the most-fascinating
model so beautifully made.
Every Saturday the model
changes her pose every half
hour so that you have to

work very fast; but it is
splendid, just what I want.
Mr Frole's criticisms on Tuesday
or Friday. I was terrified
the girls gave descriptions
of things he had said to
them. There was lots wrong
in mine but he did not
make scathing remarks which
was a great relief, especially
as he made some withering
ones to two girls next me.
Suefn is doing splendidly. Mr
Frole is ~~splendid~~ an excellent
critic he tells you things
that you can at once
get hold of or apply. Most
of the girls in the class
are not very advanced
but they are all working

2 1/2 in charcoal. The ones in
Mr Du Mond's class are chiefly
working in oils. We go in &
watch them sometimes. Mr.
Du Mond gives a lecture in
Composition once a week.
He gives a subject & you
can do a picture which
he will criticize. I think it
is quite worth while for me
to join, so I am going to
enter my name tomorrow.
It is \$3.00 a month. This week's
composition is "Autumn" but I
have not time to attempt it.
Then there are free sketch
classes in the afternoon,
three times a week lasting
for about an hour or a half.
I hope to go to those. I do

find the work nearly as
tiring as I expected & we
go to bed good & early, so
rather next-month I think
you'll have to let me work
both morning & afternoon. ~~Yes~~
I can always have off one
half of the day if I'm tired
you know. The Illustration
class is in the afternoon. Yesterday
morning when we were
working away that was a
great deal of shouting from
without & our doors were
open. (The model just had
time to take refuge behind
the screen) & a number of
the new students entered
in peals of laughter, headed

sacking & a broom tied to
his back. His face was
covered with red paint
& the cheeks of many colours
were over it. Men from
behind kept pursuing him
with their paint brushes
putting on finishing touches.
The unfortunate carried a

& which we much enjoyed.
