Dearest Mother,

G. M.'s tube was
taken out today, & the
wound is now packed
with gauze, I do not think
they will let it heal for a
few days until they are
quite, quite sure there is
nothing more to come away.
I am so thankful that the
rise in G. M.'s temperature
was not due to more pus
forming - Her heart action
has not been very good,
& she had a severe pain
in her heart for about 15-
mins. last night - So she
is not to get out of bed
for several days, but just
to keep absolutely still -

The doctors do not seem
at all anxious about it,
& look upon it as a passing
thing - I dare say the
getting up & being wheeled
about the halls etc. has been
good for the stuff that
had to come away, but
a little much for G. H.'s
strength - G. H. is greatly
relieved at the thought
of staying on at the hospital
now that she has made
up her mind to it -

It is so nice to think of
Father's feeling a little
better after such a long
while of discouragement,
I am sure it will continue

now. I have not written
very often to him as I have
nearly always had to speak
of household things to you,
but of course he shares
the news — I
did have such a nice time
this afternoon. I went to
tea at Mrs. Martins. Her
3 sons were all there, &
each one told me separately
how they had attended Father's
lectures & how very much
they had enjoyed them. One
of them said that he always
treated the students as if
they were gentlemen & that
they always felt that they
must respond. J. Martin
said he might be going out

to the Agathe next week I
would of course go to see
Father - He said that Mrs
Wolcott had asked him to
be sure to go out - It
was rather trying for me
going to the Martins as I
did - Miss Martin on
telephoning me a 2nd time
saying that I must be sure
to come, said that her
Boston brother was so
anxious to meet me again
having remembered so well
the first time he met me -
I never met him in my
life - It was Ruth -

This evening Georgie came
in to see me & was as

bright + entertaining as usual.

I gave her with your love
the other day a package of
our tea, she had great
difficulty in getting any-
thing she liked, + she
liked ours - Can she send
for some herself - What
is the address? I said
I would let her have it.

Such a lot of bills I
seem to have to enclose,
it seems to me that I
sent that one of Agilvies
before -

other morning I spent in
the Hospital grounds, it
was lovely, I hope to do
it again - when it stops

raining -

Conrad speaks of going
to Paris on Tuesday -

Mr. Fleet told me that
St. Laurent said he
