Dear Mr^s Harrington :-

Though rather belated,
I fear, I am writing you a few lines,
to express my very sincere sympathy
with you, + sorrow at the news of Doc-
tor Harrington's death, which I saw in
the Montreal papers. I would have
written to you long ago, but did not
know your address, for which I wrote
to a friend in Montreal, but have had
no answer. I should miss him
very much indeed, if I ever revisit
the college, as I always felt him to

he peculiarly my own chief in the
mining course, and I know he had a
kindly remembrance of me, as he spoke
very kindly of me to my Aunt, M^{rs}
Brossley, who met him in the summer
of 1906, I believe, crossing over from
England. The last time I saw Doc-
-tor Harrington and also Sir William
Dawson, was for a very few minutes
each in 1895, when I was on my
wedding trip in Montreal. What a
number of missing ones there would
be now among the familiar faces at
old M^cGill, Professor Darcy, Sir William

Professor Shandler and your husband
all four of the professors with whom I
had most to do. I was so grieved to
see the sad losses by fire that the
college suffered not long ago, & which
must have caused great distress to
all the old Professors like Doctor
Harrington. Baron Renaud, whom I
met last summer, told me, I think,
that the buildings were being replaced,
but of course there were thousands of
dollars worth of specimens, records, etc

are the times when it is trying not to
