Arriving in Liverpool in time
for the meeting of the British Assoc-
iation at Southport, the
Principal attended the meeting
and took part in the ^{discussions} ~~meetings~~
of the General Committee with
reference to the intended meeting
in Canada, and in the public
~~meeting~~ ^{proceedings} at the close. He also
read a paper ^{on} new facts
relating to Carboniferous
in the Geological Section, and
took part in its discussions.
After the meeting he visited
Chester, Manchester, Leeds and
Bradford, and lectured before
the Philosophical Society of Leeds
and the Students Science Society

of Manchester, He also took
 part in the exercises of the
 opening of the New Laboratories
 of Owens College and of
 the annual Commemoration of
 the Chester Natural History
 Society one of the most
 prosperous local Societies in
 England. He had opportunities
 of visiting some of the most
 important Technical Schools
 of the North of England, and
 of studying the new manage-
 ments recently made of Owens
 College and the Victoria University
 for the higher education of
 women. In further pursuit
 of ~~the~~ information on the
 latter subject a visit was

paid to the well known &
 prosperous Ladies' College of
 Cheltenham, and he spent
 two days in Cambridge, in
 visiting the Girtin and
 Newnham Colleges for women,
 in connection with these
 and the London and
 Oxford Colleges the Minutes
 have been obtained for a
 report on this subject which
 will fully explain the
 different methods now in
 operation in England with
 their results as far as
 known.
