I notice that in a number of instances when the great doleritic dykes of this region intersect the phosphatic-bearing rocks, that there are collected or located some of the more important of the openings made for this mineral. Possibly this may ^{be} a mere coincidence, & as likely it may not. With a view to the further investigation of this interesting point, I intend requesting Adams to devote his whole attention, just now, to the tracing out of some of the more important of these dykes through the County lying between Grenville & the St. Lawrence river.
