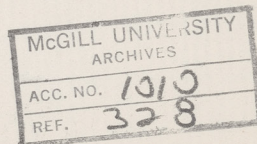

a quantity of Foolscap paper. -

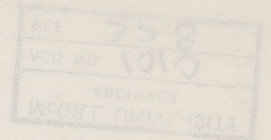
Should you so desire you could send
