My dear Sir

I enclose copy of a letter I have just rec^d from your father. You have a copy of the General Plan and therefore can readily refer to the numbers specified in your father's letter and I hope you will be able to carry out his suggestions. We still think however that the finding of the Limonite on the upper areas as already advised you of the first importance when found to be sunk on. but if possible, together with your other work, it would be very desirable to prosecute the exploration on the areas extending from McCall towards Glengarry

Especially 105 & 107. and in view
of the fact that some rights on
these areas have been taken out
by others you will see our explo-
-rations there must be completed
before the bad weather sets in this
Fall so as to enable us to make
our selection before April 1873.

With regard to the J. W. Fraser
Area - Mentworth Grant. we are
not yet decided whether we
shall not enter upon his land
under the deed we hold and
make such excavations as we
require. This matter requires
serious consideration however
and we must not do anything
