Dear George,

We received from
you last week your letter
from Lake — name not
to be distinctly made out — 15-
days from Kamloops, where
I hope you have long ago
safely arrived. I have
not returned from a
fortnight in Nova Scotia
where I have gone over
the Colquhoun and the
Eastern part of the
Gold district, in hope to
put up the eventful
of Huesman and Bond,
I have found my old views

after
noon

in the *Mein* & *Stand*.
The *Spurte* of the *Wapud*
of *Eden* & *Cape Breton*
is not *Laurentine* *juifs*
but a true *Plutone* *uch*
and must be of *Saluna*
age, and the *griefes*
and *Nice* *Schists* of the
Gold *disturb* are not
Laurentine or *Munt-Alban*
but merely altered *Cauldian*
of the *Gold* *Series*. These
things I hope to make
plain in a supplementary
chapter now in preparation.
