against it, but in  
Nova Scotia & P. S. Glam  
there is no very hard  
and fast line between  
Coal-formation and  
Permian. Between  
Els making all P. S. G. &  
Carboniferous & Fletcher  
making the upper  
Coal-formation <sup>in P. S.</sup> Permian  
a bad step has been  
made; and one

maintained for a  
moment
