the great pressure since I
received yours has on each
occasion prevented my
finishing it. Many thanks
for the book in which I hope
to be able to pass an examination

before we meet.

As far as the award you really
ought to be very proud (if
anything can make you
take a proper view of yourself).
On the matter of right - we
have won along the line, on
the question of regulations
your views are largely adopted.
Remembering the nature of
the evidence we could not
expect to get such a tribunal
to adopt absolutely our
views. I think with energy
the Canadians will be

able to make something of
the sailing in the Spring Sea
even without fire arms.

We hope to reach Montreal
about Thursday the 7th

We shall follow your
directions but our exact
route is not settled except
that we visit Toronto &
Ottawa & hope Quebec -
Send me a line to Windsor
Hotel Montreal as to where
you will be.
