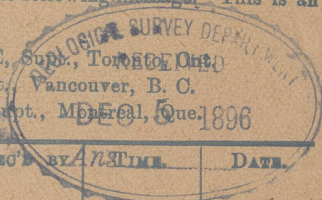

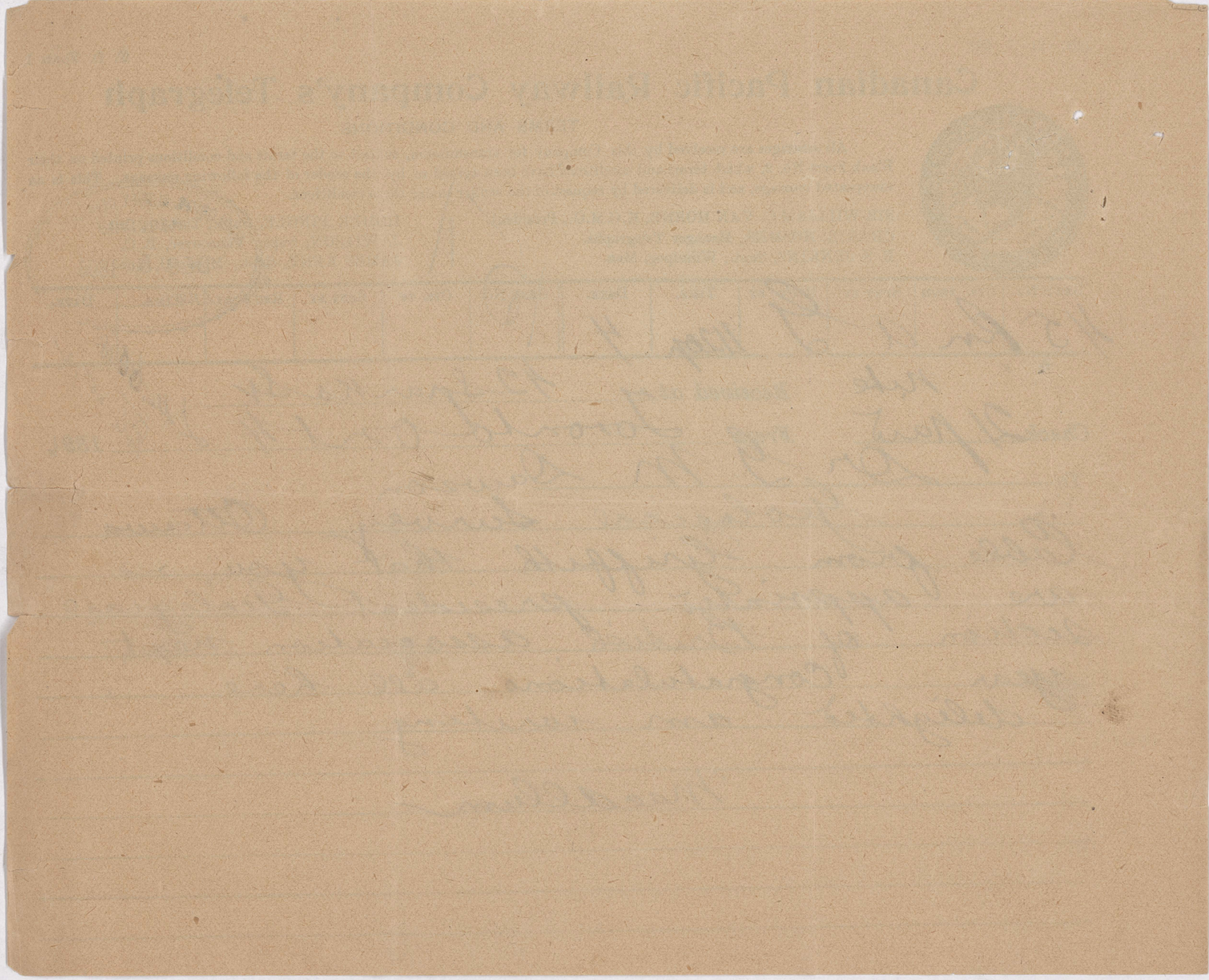

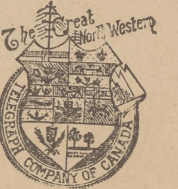

was "Will ask Dawson".

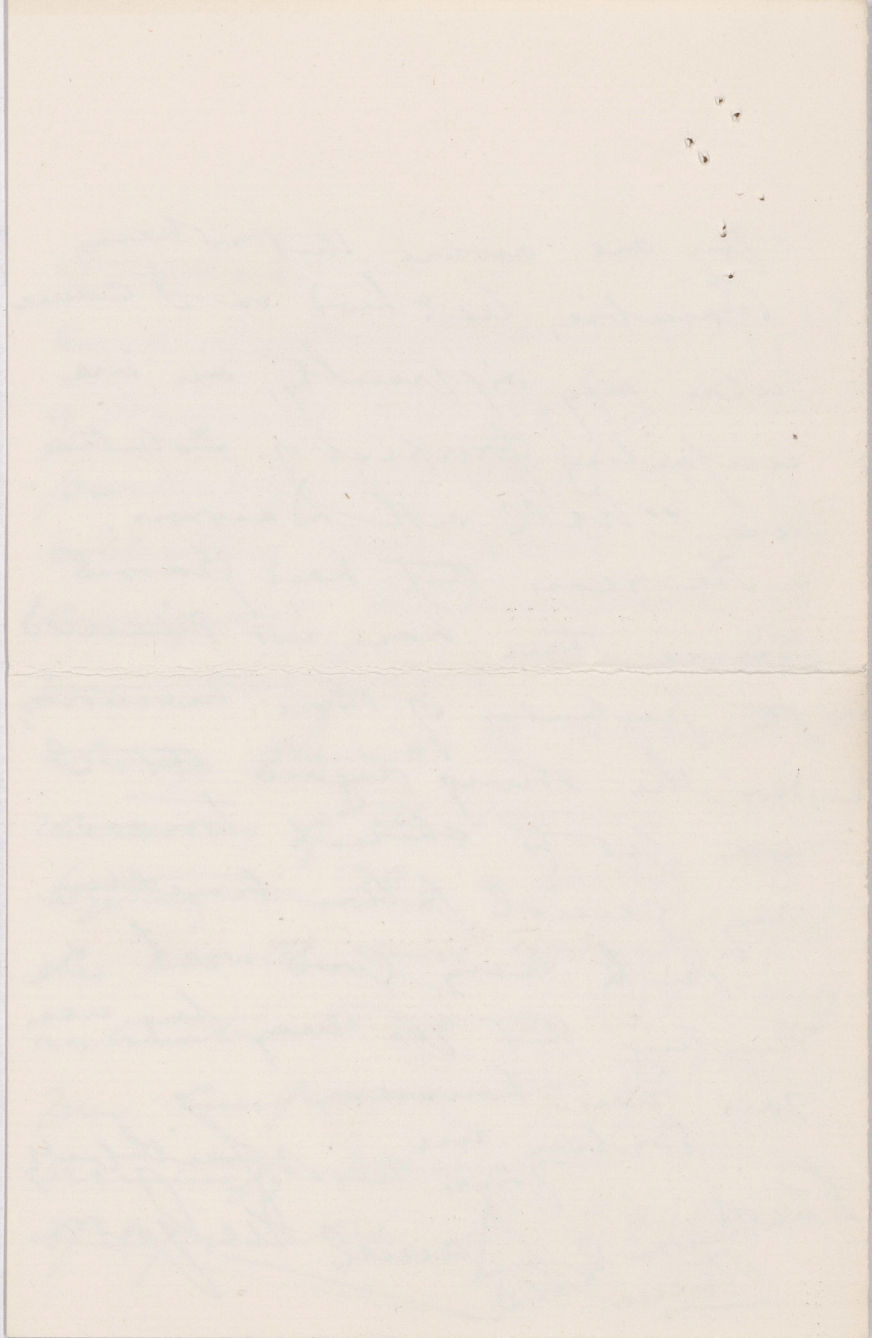
The years that have passed

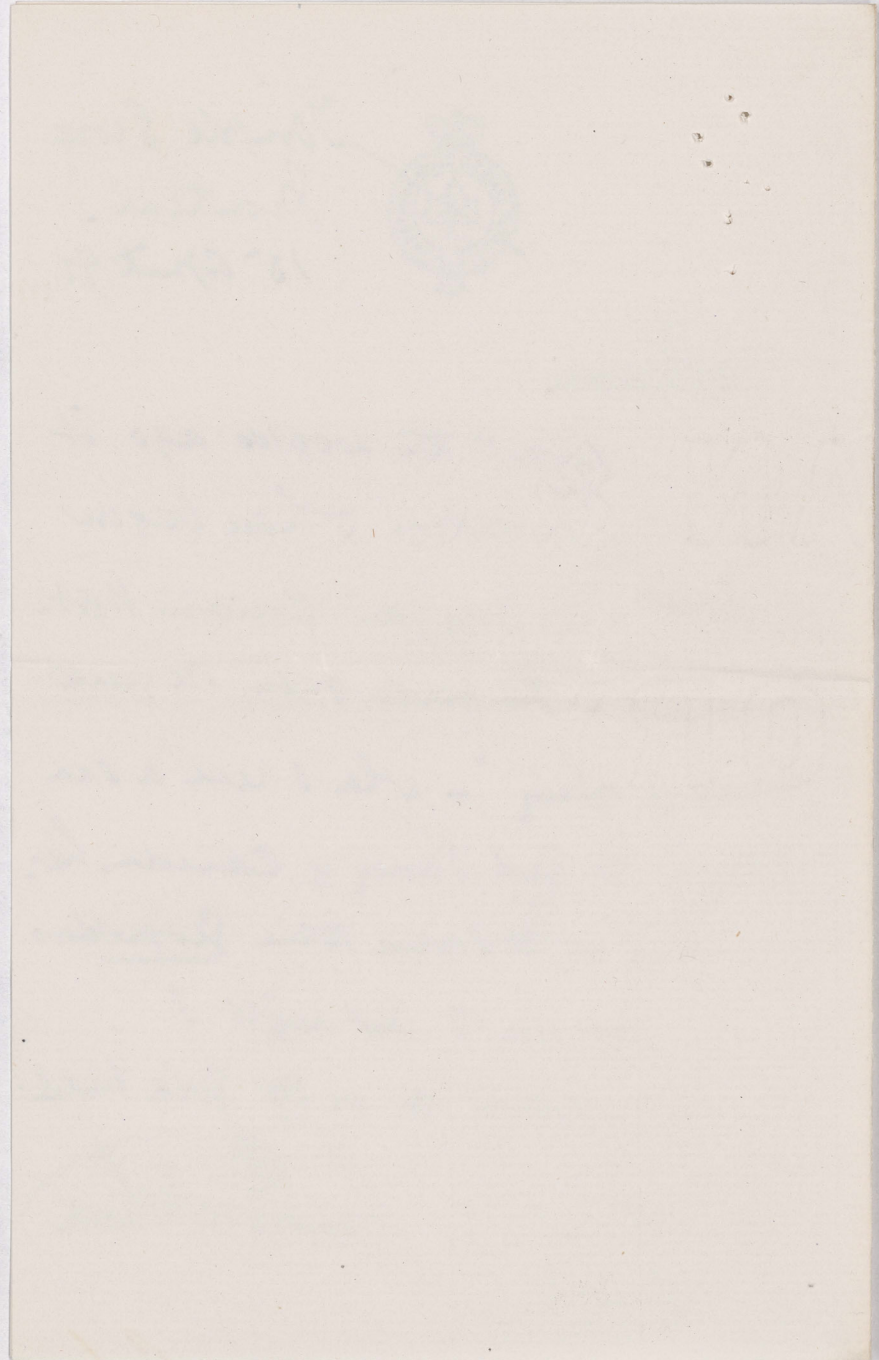
