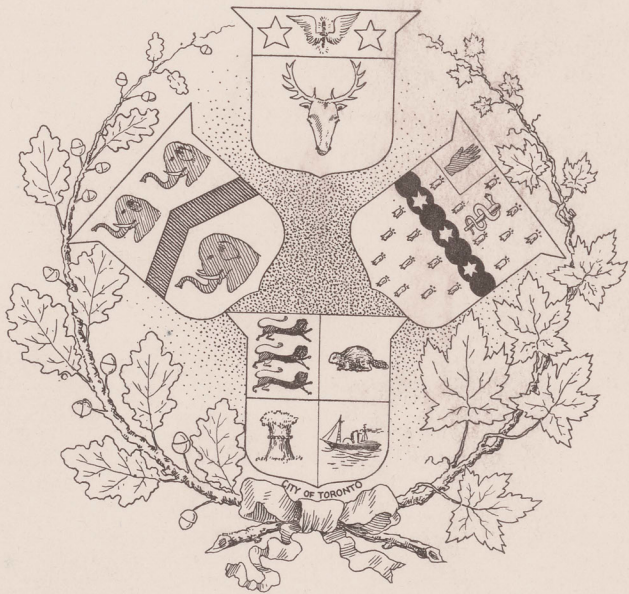
### OUR GUESTS
