*Scheme for Analysis Pelagic Affidavits
of US. Sep. 27. 92*

In treating the affidavits given in connection with U.S. Case, (App. 11.), the statements made in each instance should be classified or tabulated for comparison or easy reference. A good deal can be made of this, for there are many weak points. The affidavits referring to Pelagic Sealing (which is, however, throughout ~~unconfused~~ confused with independent native sealing) are specially important. These begin on p. 217 and run on to p. 491. Statements about Breeding Islands can be dealt with separately.

When a number of witnesses subscribe to one affidavit, each name should be given on separate line in the tabulation.

Note....Many of the Indian witnesses bore Christian names, but nearly all can be distinguished by place of residence etc., I can assist in this.

According to one witness (p 215) a space of only about 140 miles along Aleutians in which he has not seen seals. (This I think we can fill, see Evidence (C.R.) (might also refer to space assigned to sunny seals as this was gap between "herds")

Evidence here pushed almost entirely of a regular character.

Apparently a decimal part has been added to number of seals lost sea, by Saunders & others. 66% & 50% look much like 6.6% & 5.0% as shown by comparison of numbers stated by other sealers.

Indians generally have no idea of an oath. This must in some way be almost any leading question. My way to get facts from them is by means of cross questioning &c.

Note that whenever numbers taken & ^{checked by Indians} the % will be high or low. Compare with his evidence to us.

Constant mention of boat, instead of canoe, in Indian history shows artificial & misleading character of the evidence names given in most instances do not admit of discrimination between Indians & whites.
