WORLD SOLIDARITY VIETNAM WITH

On the 15th of November, people around the world will be marching against the war in Vietnam, demonstrating their solidarity with the Vietnamese people. They will be demonstrating in Japan, Europe, Canada and above all, in the United States, inspired by the 200 year struggle of the Vietnamese for their liberty from foreign domination. They are near victory and we cannot remain indifferent. Millions of Americans repudiated their government when they participated in the October 15th Moratorium, demanding immediate withdrawal of the GI's from Vietnam. Nixon's war is supported by only a minority of the American people and by fewer and fewer of the soldiers who have to do the fighting. At the same time, Trudeau is extending the criminal complicity of the Canadian government: by diplomatic support for the war, by the sale of armaments, and by the research and production of chemical and biological weapons for use against the Vietnamese people. The Canadian army is training for intervention in mass movements - the recent anti-strike "war games", and their exercises in Montreal are proof of that. This army is preparing to replace the American army in Vietnam, under the guise of an "international peace force", to prevent the Vietnamese from settling their own affairs.

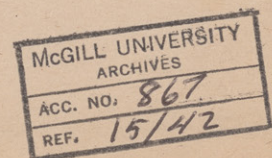
Here in Quebec the provincial government not only encourages the establishment of war industries, but, like the Canadian government, directly owns ammunition plants. It is in the Montreal region that the great bulk of Canadian armaments for Vietnam are produced. Bertrand, who claims to speak for the people of Quebec, has never dissociated himself from Trudeau's criminal policy against the Vietnamese.

Dear Professor:

The McGill Moratorium Committee, one of the few organizations of its kind in Canada, is in need of financial support. In November we carried out a number of major projects including a teach-in on Viet Nam and a simulated pacification of Frelighsburg. For these projects we obtained the financial support of McGill students and the McGill Student Society. It appears, however, that we must diversify our sources of income if we hope to overcome the public indifference which we feel contributes greatly to Canadian complicity.

We are approaching you as a university faculty member in Montreal to ask your support for a full-page advertisement to be placed in the Montreal Star on December 24th. The ad will consist of an exposition of Canadian complicity. Included will be such items as the following:

- (1) Former External Affairs Minister Paul Martin: "I don't know of any Canadian arms going to Viet Nam. I don't know of one".
- (2) Present External Affairs Minister Sharp: "We don't sell to either side".
- (3) Canadian arms sales to the U.S.A. increased from \$166 million in 1965 to \$317 million in 1967. Nothing to do with Viet Nam?
- (4) A Pentagon official was quoted as saying: "...the bulk of military equipment Canada has sold to the U.S.A. will be used in Viet Nam..."
- (5) Canada has sent some \$8 million of aid to the government of South Viet Nam. None to North Viet Nam.

If you feel Canada must renounce its support for the American war effort in Viet Nam, help us make these facts known.
