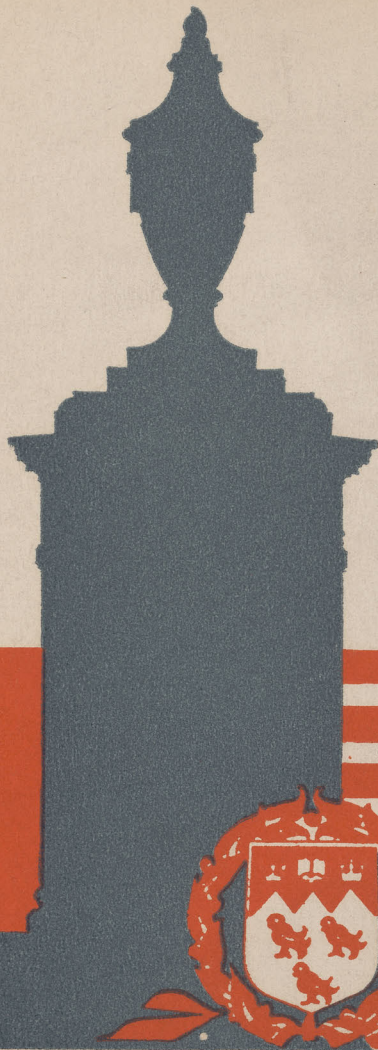

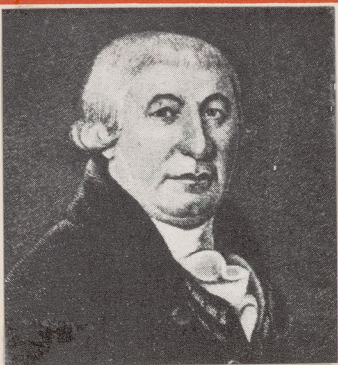


COMMEMORATING THE 200TH ANNIVERSARY
