## LONG LIVE THE VIETNAMESE REVOLUTION! DOWN WITH IMPERIALISM AND STALINISM!

LENIN: "A propaganda of peace at the present time, if not accompanied by a call to revolutionary mass actions, is only capable of spreading illusions, of demoralizing the proletariat by imbuing it with confidence in the humanitarianism of the bourgeoisie, and of making it a plaything in the hands of the secret diplomacy of the belligerent countries.

"In particular, the idea of the possibility of the so-called democratic peace without a series of revolutions is deeply erroneous."

The 'beace treaty' signed in Paris cannot bring beace to Vietnam. As long as the country remains divided, and landlords and capitalists dominate the south, there is no basis for beace. This deal is not a 'victory' for the Vietnamese, it is the framework for the continuation of the civil war.

Nixon signed the agreement only in order to provide himself with a breathing space in which to re-arm and prepare for new, more ferocious attacks. This would include the possibility of the use of nuclear weapons against Vietnam, China, and the USSR - the launching of World War III.

US imperialism requires this breathing space because it HAS SUFFERED AN ENORMOUS DEFEAT AT THE HANDS OF THE HEROIC VIETNAMESE PROPLE. The struggle could have been won outright except for the tremendous pressure exerted by the Stalinists in Moscow and Peking on the North Vietnamese to come to an agreement with Nixon.

This is recognized by the North Vietnamese themselves, as evidenced by their denunciation of Nixon's visit to Moscow last year. As Le Duc Tho stated in Paris: "So long as imperialism exists there will be war."

The obliteration bombing of North Vietnam was the response of US imperialism to the crisis of international capital. It was not an isolated gesture. It is what every capitalist class - American, Canadian, British, French, etc. - must prepare for its 'own' WORKING CLASS! This is the significance of Phase III in the US and the jailing of the trade union leaders in Canada - preparations for dictatorship!

Nixon has shown he has no intention of letting up his assault on the Vietnamese workers. He used the fraud of negotiations to prepare even more vicious bombings in December. Today he does the same.

By spreading the <u>lie</u> that Nixon can be pressured into peace with the slogan "Sign Now", the liberals, the Stalinists of the Communist Party and the revisionists of the Ligue Socialiste Cuvrière are disarming the Vietnamese and the international working class.

PROTESTS WILL NOT STOP NIXON!

Only by workers in Canada mobilizing to bring down the Liberal government and for strike action against the war can the Vietnamese workers and peasants be defended.

The Stalinist treachery poses in the sharpest possible form the struggle for Trotskyism, the construction of sections of the International Committee of the Fourth International in every country. The Vietnam 'peace settlement' confirms the correctness of Trotsky's position that the crisis of humanity is reduced to the crisis of revolutionary leadership. Peaceful co-existence is the road to defeat at the hands of imperialism, which means in this period - fascism and war.

## STOP THE BLOCKAGE STOP THE BOMBING

The Vietnamese people are winning victory after victory. The whole people, rising up, fighting shoulder to shoulder, and overcoming all obstacles in their struggle for national liberation have won smashing victories over the US aggressors and their puppet Saigon troops. Three provinces have recently been totally liberated. The puppet army is disintegrating—it is an army completely opposed by the people and supported only by the US rulers—and thousands of its soldiers are deserting over to the liberation forces.

Now being defeated, US imperialism thrashes about like a wild animal. Monday night, Nixon announced still more crimes to be committed against the Vietnamese people: the mining and blockading of ports, and the increased bombing of railways, roads, and bridges. He forgot to mention the bombing of the dykes constructed to prevent flooding. He forgot to also mention the ruthless bombing of Vietnamese cities every day by B-52s. The crimes and murders of US imperialism will never be forgotten.

And the Vietnamese people have given their answer: people's war, a struggle waged by the whole people for freedom and independence. Like every other US military adventure in Indochina, the blockade, too, will end in disaster for the US rulers. The US aggressor lifts a rock only to drop it on its own feet. The blockade is a sign of its growing weakness and desperation.

The national liberation struggle of the Vietnamese and other Indochinese peoples is in the interests of all the oppressed people of the world. It serves as a powerful inspiration to oppressed people everywhere. The same enemy which so ruthlessly attacks the Vietnamese spreads out its fangs and oppresses peoples all over the world for its selfish economic and political gain. We thank the Vietnamese people for fighting so long, so hard, and so successfully against US imperialism. The Vietnamese people ask for our support—we must give it and show our opposition to US aggression.

The blockade and bombing crimes of the US rulers will be defeated. Victory belongs to the peoples of Vietnam, Laos, and Cambodia--this is irreversable. It is for us to support this heroic struggle.

On December 14, 1969, at the National Assembly of the Committee For People's Democratic Rights, it was brought to our attention by the McGill Student Front that the democratic rights of McGill students have been threatened by yourselves, by others in the Administration and by the Executive of the Students' Society, and specifically the rights of those who are opposed to the appointment of General Nayanto Nath Chaudhuri, the notorious criminal and the previous High Commissioner of India to Canada.

As these students have clearly demonstrated, the General is not welcome in Quebec because the people of Quebec know his history as a murderer of large numbers of the Indian people, as a traitor to his own people and as a faithful servant to the Bristish colonialists and the U.S. imperialists; the Quebec people know as well the role which he is playing here in Quebec which is to do research for the imperialists in order to develop better instruments and methods for the oppression of the people of Asia and Africa. These students and professors interested only in safeguarding the democratic rights and lives of people had no choice but to oppose this militaristic action taken by the McGill Administration and therefore called for the formation of the McGill Committee to Oppose General Chaudhuri. The Committee immediately initiated an agitational campaign in order to inform students of the history of Chaudhuri and of the implications of the research he is carrying out on Quebec soil.

Since October the Committee has collected more than 500 signatures of students and professors who are opposed to the hiring of General Chaudhuri by your Administration.

-On November 6th the Committee led a militant demonstration to the Centre for Developing-Area Studies and because of this police were called on

campus by your administration.

-On December 1st members of the Committee visited the General at the

Centre and once again you responded by calling in the police.

-Throughout the Committee has held many public meetings and conferences to bring their stand against militarism to the students. Your response has been the continual harrassment of these students and

the threatening of their right to express their opposition:

1) you summoned police onto the campus to protect this murderer (November 6,1969 and December 1,1969); and

2) you have sent letters to certain individual students (November 20 and December 4) in an attempt to intimidate them from taking action and to assure yourselves that these students are "aware of the rights and limits of protest"(to Arnold August on December 4).

Last week the police were called on campus twice: once on December 8th at the call of a Zionist and again on December 11th to defend fascists from some progressive students known for their position on Chaudhuri.

Since last Thursday, the Students' Society has banned all progressive groups including the Committee to Oppose General Chaudhuri from the University Centre.

All these measures, these attempts at intimidation, these fascist tactics used by you, your Administration and your Students! Society Executive: defense of a criminal, calling the police on the campus, collaboration with the police (exchange of names, dossiers and photographs), defense of those who oppose the practice of fundamental democratic rights (the banning of meetings of progressive groups) - all this has been brought to the attention of the National Assembly, all this has been discussed and thus, conscious of the situation, we have UNANIMOUSLY ADOPTED the following resolution:

"We, members of the Committee For Peoples' Democratic Rights, present at this National Assembly of December 14, 1969, on the 132nd Anniversary of the heroic death of Dr. Chenier, the Great Patriotic Quebecois who fell in the resistance struggle against colonialism and repression, condemn the fascist action committed by the Administration of McGill University and by the Executive of the Students' Society which have threatened the democratic rights of McGill students to express their opposition and to hold meetings. We give out total support to McGill Student Front which has taken up this case of flagrant repression and we promise to give them whatever help is necessary to defend the democratic rights of McGill students."
