

The Secretary (Miss M. A. WILLIS), to whom all inquiries should be addressed, is in attendance daily from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., excepting Saturday.

The minimum Annual Subscription for Membership of the Fellowship of Medicine and Post-Graduate Medical Association is 10s. od. (or \$2.50), payable on 1st January in each year. For Members joining after September 30th in each year the subscription for the remainder of the current year shall be 5s.

The Medical Schools in London and other Hospitals mentioned on page 96 admit holders of Fellowship Post-Graduate tickets to their General Practice, including Clinical Instruction in the Wards and Out-Patient Departments, Clinical Lectures and Demonstrations, P.M. Demonstrations, &c.

Special Lectures and Demonstrations are given from time to time by some of the Hospitals for which additional fees may be required, and as these occur an announcement will be made in the BULLETIN.

Tickets for any period can be obtained at the rate of one week, 2 gns.; two weeks, 3 gns.; one month, 5 gns.; two months, 9 gns.; three months, 12 gns.; six months, 18 gns.; and one year, 20 gns. Holders of general tickets can attend the Special Courses (with certain exceptions) during the currency of the ticket on payment of a registration fee of 5s. for each Course. Cheques should be made payable to the Fellowship of Medicine and crossed "Barclay & Co."

UNIVERSITIES BUREAU OF THE BRITISH EMPIRE.

AMERICAN UNIVERSITY UNION IN EUROPE.

It is an international clearing house for information and advice, open from 9.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m., except on Saturdays, when it closes at 1 p.m.

THE ENGLISH-SPEAKING UNION.

Members of the Fellowship of Medicine are invited to make use of the rooms of the English-Speaking Union at No. 1, Charing Cross (immediately overlooking Trafalgar Square), which are open from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m., and on Sundays from 2 to 7 p.m. Afternoon tea can be obtained at a moderate cost and use can be made of Library, Writing Room, telephone and periodicals. The Reception Secretary is always at the service of visitors.

COMMENTS.

The attention of Post-Graduates is particularly directed to the special announcements on the following page. A careful perusal of these will be repaid by the information conveyed of the varied opportunities offered for meeting individual requirements. Some of the Courses in question are supplementary to those announced in the ordinary programme. The advantage of special Courses is that they admit of individual teaching. The numbers are limited, and because of this each member of the Course is free to examine patients and receive the personal assistance of the teacher. At a Post-Graduate College which we have in mind this method of teaching proved highly

popular. The procedure followed was to place a notice on the Notice Board intimating that a class in some subject would be held, and Post-Graduates were asked to add their names as desirous of joining. The number was limited to six. Every class was repeated according to the demand expressed. One of the most popular was that on intestinal surgery, in which the Post-Graduates were taught the methods of suturing the intestines and other details of technique, bullocks' intestines being used for the purpose.

The special Courses which have been arranged by the Fellowship of Medicine on Dermatology, Gynaecology, Ophthalmology, and Venereal Diseases in the course of the present session, have all been well attended, and have proved a popular addition to the general Course. Thus as experience confirms, special classes form an integral part of Post-Graduate teaching for which it is expedient to make full provision.

It will be of advantage to point out the new special Courses which will begin in January next. The Dermatology Course has been arranged for January 28th till February 9th; the Course in Ophthalmology held in September will be repeated in January; the Course in the Treatment of Fevers will begin at the North Eastern Fever Hospital on January 9th and conclude on the 26th; in January also the Genito-Urinary Course held last October will be repeated; Dr. Eric Pritchard will resume his popular Course in Infants' Diseases, at the Infants' Hospital, Vincent Square, Westminster, on January 7th, concluding on the 19th. The National Hospital for Diseases of the Heart will begin a special two weeks' Intensive Course in Cardiology on January 14th. Again a special Post-Graduate Course in General Medicine and Surgery has been arranged at the London Temperance Hospital, beginning on January 7th and continuing till the 19th. This Course will be held in conjunction with the following hospitals: Bethlem Royal, the North Western Fever, and the Royal Westminster Ophthalmic. Finally, from January 7th to February 2nd a special Course will be given at the West End Hospital for Nervous Diseases on the Diagnosis and Treatment of common Nervous Disorders. All information relating to these Courses, fees, &c., can be obtained from the Secretary to the Fellowship, 1, Wimpole Street, W.1.

The fact may be noted that in most of the special Courses above mentioned these are being repeated. There was evidence that, on the first occasion, they met with much approval; the appreciation of the Post-Graduates being shown by the numbers joining them. What may be concluded is that these special Courses offer a wide field for meeting individual requirements. Moreover, a further inducement to join the Courses is that the fees are moderate, having regard to the instruction provided. Thus there is reason for believing that these special Courses will eventually become a predominating and an attractive feature of the Association's work.

After three years' excellent service, Mr. Paterson's colleague, Dr. Henry MacCormac, has resigned his post as Honorary Secretary, and much regret has been expressed at his retirement. Dr. MacCormac will be especially remembered for his arduous efforts in connection with the arrangement of special Courses, about eighteen months ago. Their design was such that, although more or less of the nature of an experiment, there was the promise in them of proving very successful, and it is due to his pioneer work in this respect that the present programme of special Courses came into being. To the vacancy created by Dr. MacCormac's resignation, Dr. A. J. Whiting has been appointed. Dr. Whiting, as is known, was one of the founders of the Post-Graduate College associated with the Prince of Wales' General Hospital, and acted as Dean there for many years. He will therefore bring to the post his long experience of Post-Graduate work.


