

To W. O. from Dr. Flick.

Philadelphia,

My dear Dr. Osler:

I telegraphed you last night that we would have the dinner, the meeting, and the lecture all on the same day, March 26th, believing at that time that we could get the hall for the lecture on that date. I find this morning that we cannot get the hall for the 26th, and therefore must have the lecture on the 28th as heretofore fixed. I have telegraphed you this morning that we will be glad to have the dinner, meeting and lecture on the 28th. In order to do this I will give a luncheon in the afternoon instead of the dinner, as we have arranged to give Maragliano a reception in the evening after his lecture. If you will kindly fix the date of the meeting I will then arrange for my luncheon. I would be glad if you could let me know about this matter at once so that I could send out the invitations to some of the men in other cities whom I would like to have present.
