Dear Adami,

So glad to have your letter of the 19th today. How glad you must be to have got out in time. Poor dear! I think of her as the sweet little girl I knew with Maggie Francis. I have been expecting to hear of your arrival in England but at "86" the other day I was told of your transfer temporarily to Ottawa. All are so glad that Jones is back and the arrangement seems to be that Foster goes in with Jones as a general inspector, this is the rumour. Perley tells me that Bruce is raging with me. My only points were the irregularity in the apt. and the injustice to Jones. I hope things will quiet down as it is bad for the service to have these discussions. Of course Hughes must be furious, it was a case of Hamans gallows. I have been laid up with a sharp attack of Bronchitis—all right again now but I am taking it easy in these cold days.

Revere keeps well—has had 3 months in the Ancre—the battery in continuous action. We heard today that they had gone to rest—billets. Love to the children. Let us know when you come over.
