(1868 - 1885)

Bibliographical Note - The great biographical interest which attaches to the stury of Sir William Osler's early Canadian publications is enhanced by their grouping under various subjects in the chronological order in which his interests developed, and this attempt is therefore made here. First and most illuminating of all are his boyhood and early student researches in natural history (1867-70) which are from the beginning highly scientific, and yet alive with a really passionate intensity of interest in the study of living things. Next came his observations in normal and pathological histology as seen in the reports attached to his "Cases under the care of Dr. D.C. MacCallum" (1873) and his graduation thesis; then his studies in physiology under Prof. Burden Sanderson (1873) and in pathology with Virchow and Rokitansky (1873-74); his early collegiate work at McGill (1875-77); then the flood of pathological studies and reports bearing upon his museum collection; and lastly his clinical and editorial work at Montreal. His purely literary activity was a product of his later life, but there are abundant traces here in the biographical notes of his Foreign Correspondence. (1873-1874; 1881; and 1884)

This Canadian bibliography is still to be regarded as incomplete and will yield further fruit to a more extended research, but as the early sources are largely Canadian it contains many additional items to Miss Blogg's admirable bibliography of Osler's entire works, which in the new edition forms a practically complete compendium of his later, American and English periods. # In "Sir William Osler, Bart"
