1. Abyssinia - Lobe (Jerome) A voyage of Abyssinia. With a continuation of the history of Ab-down to the beginning of the 18th century. Translated from the French by Samuel Johnson. London: for A. Batlesworth & Co. Hitch. 8vo., 1st ed. Autography of Horne Took on fly leaf. A rare book, calf, good condition.

2. A.B.C. The. - with Paternoster, Ave, Crede and Ten Commandments in Englysshe newly translated and set forth at the kings most gracyous Commandement. London. 8vo. Black letter. No date, but I have found in Ames Typographical antiquities something similar of about 1500. It is printed on one side to be folded back so that the blank leaves may be pasted together and form one leaf or two, or four small leaves of the whole sheet; unbound, but in good condition. Extremely rare.

3. Augustinus (S.) Liber, qui vocatur quinquaginta. colophon anno dei. MCCCLXXV, circit kal' Februarii Impressus est liber iste ad honorem dei P. Anthoniu Sorg in Augusta. 1475. Sm. folio. Gothic letter, printed in long lines, 38 to the page, with ornamented capitals painted by hand - marone morocco gilt and blindtooled. Magnificent copy. This is the first book printed by Anton Sorg at Augsburg.

4. Arley (Peter). The names of Baylyfs, doctours of Physick, Mayers, Sherefs & lawyers of ye Cyte of London, etc. Thick 4to. Black letter, no date nor can I find any information about it except in David Clements "Bibliothque Curieuse" where a list of the same kind is mentioned. In a most curious binding (probably contemporary), black calf stamped, with silver clasps and about a foot and a half of heavy iron chain. Good wood-cut portraits of the doctours of physick. Several pages stained, but otherwise in good condition.
