The Author of these papers was one of the most brilliant young men it has ever been my lot to teach. The 2nd son of Dr. MacCallum of Dunnville, Ont. and the bro. of W. G. MacCallum, Assoc. Prof. of Path. at the Johns Hopkins Univ., he had a most distinguished career at our Medical School and while an undergraduate wrote several papers of unusual merit. He joined the Anatomical Dept. under Dr. Mall and at once begun a series of most interesting researches, many of which have been published in the J.H. Reports and Bulletin and in the Anatom. *Anzeiger*. He went to Leipsic to study with His, and while there, like my good friend Jack Hewetson, the first symptoms of tuberculosis appeared. For a time he improved and went to Berkeley Coll with Prof. Loeb who soon appreciated his remarkable skill as an investigator: but alas! he succumbed suddenly, to the irreparable loss of science in America. He had a mind of singular acuteness, a clear judgment and he had caught from Mall some measure of that investigating spirit that has made the Anatomical School of the Johns Hopkins University so famous. When the news reached me of his death, one morning as I sat at breakfast, I broke down in an irresistible paroxysm of regret and had to leave the table.
