

in the Oxford 1831 (J. Vincent) copy is this note by W.O.

The signature in p. 113 S.T.C. made me think that this copy was annotated by Samuel Taylor Colridge and I had letters of his loaned me to compare the signature which seems to be identical, particularly in a scrap loaned me by Dr. Watson of 44 Welbeck Street, which had the letters S.T.C. at the bottom, identical on mode of formation. However the references to Wilkin's edition which appeared in 1836 and a note which gives a date at end 1840 would seem to make this impossible as Colridge died in 1834. The notes may be there of Greenhill, whose handwriting I have not yet seen.
