In the MS volume Amariah Brigham's Journals occurs the following note:- Journals of Amariah Brigham (1798-1848) during the years 1828-29 in Europe Hunt in Gross' American Medical Biography, p. 525, says "He left in this voyage, July 16, 1828, then in his thirtieth year. It would be interesting and instructive to follow him in his travels which embraced a tour and residence, more or less prolonged, in England, Ireland, Scotland, France, Italy, Sicily and Spain, and extract liberally from his voluminous journal, but the space will not permit. He made a daily record of his observations, indeed of whatever especially attracted his notice, which formed five folio volumes in manuscript". I have forgotten where I got these two descriptive of Italy and the voyage home. Some one sent them. I thought it was Bloomer of Providence but he said no. I must find out at Hertford or Utica as they should be with the other volumes.
