W.O.'s note of June 3, 1919:- This was the first dinner since the war. Rosebery could not come - ill. Lord Aldenham was in the chair and in order round the table - Lord Ilchester, John Murray, Churchill, Cockerell, Osler, Kenyon, Hagberg Wright, Hornby, and Yates Thompson. The Toast of the Club and its Founders was drunk, and we toasted Yates Thompson on the success of his sale held to-day, 30 items, £52,000! Business meeting before dinner Elected Lord Crawford and arranged for books. Very jolly dinner. Aldenham said at last dinner which was given

by Earl of Plymouth, just before the war, Eyre, the oldest Member, turned up and as he had not been at a Meeting for 25 years, A. did not know him and thought he was a new Member and was about to ask him to sign the book!

The early records of the Club, A. said had been destroyed. They came into possession of Dilke who published some scurrilous articles in the Athenæum. Hasleworth afterwards published the Roxburghe Revels.
