Dear Sir,

I have your letter of July 31st. On consulting the University records I find that the Honorary Degree of LL.D. was conferred upon Sir William Osler, by the University of Toronto, in absentia, at the regular Commencement Exercises held on June 10th, 1899, at the Pavilion in the Horticultural Gardens, Toronto. The Chancellor at that time was the Hon. Edward Blake, M.A., LL.D., Q.C., M.P.

The following also received the Honorary Degree of LL.D. at the same time - Dr. John Beattie Crozier, Dr. George M. Dawson, Mr. J. C. Glashan, Principal G. M. Grant, Queen's University, Kingston, and Sir John Murray, F.R.S.


I find also that Sir William received the Honorary Degree of D.C.L. in 1902 from the University of Trinity College, which was at that time a separate University, but which has since federated with the University of Toronto and is now an Arts College in the University.
