Dear Dr. Robb:

I can't tell you how happy we are to feel that your boy turned to us the moment he was in reach of Oxford. Also, I think it is delightful that you have brought him up to realize that your old friends must be his friends - He telephoned from Reading and came at once for the week end. - He was not feeling very well when he arrived and the next morning played tennis with the Wright girls and came back to bed - Influenza is epidemic in England & he has a slight attack. He is not at all bad and will be all right in another day - It is such a comfort to have him here and to look after him. He is in Revere's room and I like to feel the old association continues. How splendid he is to look at - such a fine face! I am delighted with all he tells me about his happy marriage etc.

I pray he may be saved to go back to you and his wife. -
