Letter from Lady Stamfordham to Lady Osler.

Dear Lady Osler,

There is one letter that my mother always kept from your dear husband telling her all about my brother's death in the small-pox Hospital at Montreal, on October 25, 1875, but I am afraid it only touches on all the incidents of, as you rightly say, our "tragedy". It is the most beautiful sympathetic letter and was the greatest solace to us all. I have written to my brother and my sister to beg them to find the letter. Do you remember that on the exact anniversary 30 years later I had the happiness off meeting Sir William at the Teignmouths for the 1st time?

How very much I should like to see you again! You and I have been through the same deep waters, but you have had to face another different flood that I have not been called upon to struggle through. I so often think of you.
