The Rev. Thomas Hincks, F.R.S., described, in the

-

"Annals and Magazine of Natural History", a supposed Pterobranchiate Polyzoon from Canada, sent to him by the late Prof.

Hincks of Univ. College, Toronto. The general description of
this corresponds to the Pectinatella magnifica, except in the
arrangement of the tentacles, which were borne on two distinct
erect lobes, and not disposed in a horse-shoe figure. Dr.

Osler was of opinion that there had been a slight error in observation, and that the species was the Pectinatella. He was
confirmed in this by the fact that he had himself taken the spe-

cimen to Prof. Hincks, when a member of his botany class, and so

far as he remembers, it presented the characteristics which he

afterwards learned were peculiar to the Pectinatella."
