This door was saved when the frame house at the corner of King
Street East and Walnut Street, which had been occupied for fully 40
years by William I.A. Case, M.D., was torn down in July, 1894. It in-
spired an editorial "Doctors' Signs," there is every reason to believe
by Wm Osler, M.D. then of Montreal, now of the John Hopkins Hospital, Bal-
timore, Maryland, U.S.A. which appeared in the Canadian Medical and Sur-
gical Journal of June 1883.

The photograph ^{attached to the door} is of the Doctor in the window on Walnut St.,
which he occupied, except when at meals, from daybreak till darkness, for
years after he had given up his practice.
From his seat he nodded to his numerous acquaintances in the street and
chatted to everyone willing to give the news or to listen to ~~his~~ re-
marks of passing events.

Wm I. Case, son of Wm Case M.D. V.E. L., came to this country in
1809 from Pennsylvania when 4 years old.
