Shepherd told me that in 1884 H. C. Wood appeared unannounced in Montreal to investigate W.O. It was generally known that he had ~~been~~ *committed himself to Osler*. much opposed to the appointment. Dick McDonald, whoever he was, encountered him and went around with him. He first went to the French hospitals, and to Wood's surprise he found that the French with whom Osler was extremely popular all spoke enthusiastically of the young man. Then to the Montreal General where the enthusiasm of the young House Staff whom he encountered was so unmistakably genuine that Wood was convinced.

It is interesting that Osler's early ability to bring warring factions together, as in the case of the English and French in Montreal, was shown early, and doubtless had an influence in taking him to Philadelphia where this quality was much needed.
