Oxford Appointment

At a meeting of Oxford medical graduates, held in London on January 5, 1904, a resolution was passed that "in the opinion of the meeting the Regius Professorship of Medicine should be held by a physician who is representative of medicine in its widest sense". It was held by resolution that the Regius "ought to be a man who could be accepted as a leader and representative in Oxford of the medical graduates and one to whom they would with all confidence give their loyal support." All agreed that Oxford had obtained just such a man. W.O. was never too much occupied with science or practice to meet on the common level and assist in every movement for the improvement of the profession - few men so well combine the qualities of leadership, tact, unselfishness, active interest in everything professional, and ability so conspicuous as to be recognized by all without jealousy.
